A. Nursing Programs

Nursing Programs	Training Duration
B. Sc (Basic)	4 years (including internship)
B.Sc (Post Basic)	2 years
M. Sc.	2 years

Eligibility Criteria

B. Sc. (N)

- The minimum age for admission shall be 17 years on 31st December of the year in which admission is sought.
- Minimum education:
 - 10+2 class passed with Science (PCB) & English individually and must have obtained a minimum of 45% marks taken together in (PCB) at the qualifying examination i.e., (10+2) from recognized board under AISSE/CBSE/ICSE/SSCE/HSCE or other equivalent Board.
- Student shall be medically fit.
- Students appearing in 10+2 examinations in Science conducted by National Institute of Open School with 45% marks.
- Students shall be admitted once in a year.
- - the candidates belonging to SC/ ST or other backward classes, the marks obtained in PCB taken together in qualifying examination be 40% .

Post Basic B. Sc. (N)

- Passed the Higher Secondary or Senior Secondary or Intermediate or 10+2 or an equivalent examination recognized by the university for this purpose. Those who have done 10+1 in or before 1986, will be eligible for admission.
- Obtained a certificate in General Nursing and Midwifery and registered as R.N.R.M. with the State Nurses Registration Council. A male nurse, trained before the implementation of the

new integrated course besides being registered as a nurse with State Nurses Registration Council, shall produce evidence of training approved by Indian Nursing Council for a similar duration in lieu of midwifery in any one of the following areas:

- O.T. Techniques
 - Ophthalmic Nursing
 - Leprosy Nursing
 - TB Nursing
 - Psychiatric Nursing
 - Neurological and Neuro surgical Nursing
 - Community Health Nursing
 - Cancer Nursing
 - Orthopedic Nursing
- Candidates shall be medically fit.
 - Students shall be admitted once in a year.

M. Sc. (N)

- The candidate should be a Registered Nurse and Registered midwife of equivalent with any State Nursing Registration Council.
- The Minimum education requirements shall be the passing of: B.Sc. Nursing/B.Sc. Hons. Nursing/Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing with minimum of 55% aggregate marks.
- The candidate should have undergone in B.Sc. Nursing / B.Sc. Hons. Nursing / Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing in an institution which is recognized by Indian Nursing Council.
- Minimum one year of work experience after Basic B.Sc. Nursing.
- Minimum one year of work experience prior or after Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing.

B.Staffing pattern from 2014-15 onwards

The following qualification and experience for nursing faculty in collegiate programme is prescribed for 2014-15 academic year and onwards.

- a) **Principal cum Professor** – 15 years experience with M.Sc(N) out of which 12 years should be teaching experience with minimum of 5 years experience in collegiate programme.Ph.D(N) is desirable.

- b) **Vice – Principal cum Professor** – 12 years experience with M.Sc(N) out of which 10 years should be teaching experience with minimum of 5 years experience in collegiage programme.Ph.D(N) is desirable.
- c) **Professor** - 10 years experience with M.Sc(N) out of which 7 years should be teaching experience.Ph.D(N) is desirable.
- d) **Associate Professor / Reader** - M.Sc(N) with 8 years including 5 years teaching experience.Ph.D(N) is desirable.
- e) **Associate Professor / Lecturer** - M.Sc(N) with 3 years teaching experience.Ph.D(N) is desirable.
- f) **Tutor / Clinical Instructor** - M.Sc(N) or B.Sc(N) / P.B.B.Sc(N) with 1 year experience.
